From the Pastor's Keyboard...

During the Lenten season we are reminded of the time Jesus spent in the wilderness. We are also mindful of those who are walking in the wilderness right now: those who are facing the loss of a loved one, an illness, or the illness of a loved one, just to name a few. May we keep all of those who are hurting in our hearts and prayers and reach out to help as we are able.

A few years ago, I went online to research early Christian celebrations of Lent and Holy Week. I discovered that much of what we know, comes from the diary of a woman who made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land from 381–384 CE. Egeria was from Gallaecia, in northern Portugal. She shared detailed information about her pilgrimage throughout the Holy Land in a letter to a group of women back home. Part of her letter was discovered in a monastic library in Arezzo, Italy in 1884.

Egeria wrote before the liturgical calendar was fully developed, before Jesus' birth was celebrated on December 25th, and before Ash Wednesday was commemorated. She speaks of gathering for Sabbath worship on the seventh day, (Saturday) and again on the Lord's Day, (Sunday). She speaks in detail about worship on each of the Paschal Days (Lent). In Jerusalem, the preparation for Easter, was 8 weeks long because neither the Sabbath, nor the Lord's day were included in the 40 fast days. (Today, only Sunday, is not included in the 40 fast days.)

What we call Holy Week, was known as "The Great Week", and they commemorated the events of each day of Jesus' final week. They gathered to worship each day with hymns, prayers, and the reading of the scriptures that pertained to that day. On Wednesday, Egeria writes, the priest "reads that passage where Judas Iscariot went to the Jews to set the price they would pay him to betray the Lord. While this passage is being read, there is such moaning and groaning from among the people that no one can help being moved to tears in that moment." (Egeria: Diary of a Pilgrim p. 107)

Robert Webber, in Preacher's Magazine (3/1/88) states that: "These ancient Christians were convinced that the resurrection could not be adequately experienced without traveling the way of death themselves. They desired to fulfill Jesus' admonitions of Mark 10 in a literal way by taking up the cross and going up to Jerusalem with him (v.33)...The intent was to prepare for Easter by reliving the mystery. Fasting and prayer... led the participants into a deeper experiential appreciation of the mystery of salvation... By hearing the Word and by acting it out—not just for a day, but over a period of time—the message took hold more firmly. This week of the climactic events of the arrest, conviction, crucifixion, death, burial, and resurrection of Christ is the most extraordinary week in the Christian calendar, the week in which the redemption of the world happened, in which the re-creation of the world began." Unquote.

Egeria revealed that as Christians gathered each day of Holy Week to journey with Christ, they would hear the words that Jesus spoke, and remember the events that took place on that day. And as they relived the events, there were moments in which it seemed they were there, with Christ in his suffering.

Without the crucifixion, we cannot experience the resurrection. Without suffering, we cannot fully experience Joy. Unless we enter into our own wilderness experiences, we cannot fully experience Christ's suffering and the fullness of God's presence and power with us. My prayer is that by spending time in prayer, meditation, and Bible Study; by remembering Christ's life, ministry, suffering, and death; we will open ourselves to spiritual growth and new life. May this new life come to us – both as individuals and as congregations – that we may be able to fully experience the joy of the Resurrection.
