From the Pastor's Keyboard...

Ash Wednesday, February 26th, is the first day of Lent. The 40 days of Lent (not including Sundays) represents the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness after his baptism. Jesus spent this time in fasting and prayer as a way to prepare himself for his ministry.

Since the year 323 A.D., when the Council of Nicaea was held, Lent has consisted of a 40 day period of fasting prior to Easter. Early Christians at eonly one meal each day, in the early evening; and they refrained from eating meat and drinking wine. Later, Christians also abstained from eating eggs, dairy products and fat. Shrove Tuesday and Mardi Gras (French for Fat Tuesday) celebrations come from the tradition of emptying the home of ingredients such as butter, milk and eggs that would spoil and that were not supposed to be eaten during Lent. The tradition of eating pancakes on Fat Tuesday goes back to at least the middle ages.

The Lenten Season has traditionally been viewed as a time of preparation for Christians. Lent is a time in which we reflect on our lives and repent for our sins; a time in which we try to live more faithfully by spending time in prayer, fasting, and Bible study. In the early church, the period of Lent was an intense time of repentance, study and preparation for new believers who would be baptized on Easter Sunday. It was also a time for those who had committed serious sins to be reconciled by penitence and forgiveness and restored to the fellowship of the church.

For us as individuals, Lent is a time when we are invited to look at ourselves, to confess our sins, and to turn to God in repentance. We recognize that we sin in thought, word and deed, by things we have done and things we have not done. We sin as we fail to discern God's will and to live according to God's will for our lives.

Through the years, the requirements of fasting and sacrifice have been relaxed. Yet, by observing the Lenten Season, as individuals and as a congregation, we are able to grow in faith and in faithfulness. Traditionally, Christians give up something for Lent. This can be a helpful discipline for us.

But there is also a benefit to taking something on as a way to observe a faithful Lent. Write letters to people who have touched you to thank them and let them know how much you appreciate them. Reach out to someone who has a special need. Visit someone who is ill or who is lonely. Share a meal with someone who usually eats alone. Offer support to someone who needs a friend. Apologize to someone you have hurt or offended in some way. Forgive someone who has offended you. Listen to Christian music. Spend time each day reading scripture or a daily devotional. Spend some time each day in prayer, not just talking to God, but listening to what God has to say to you. Take time to nourish your relationship with God.

Lent is a time of remembering the sacrifice that Jesus made for us and entering into a deeper relationship with Him. I pray that this Lenten Season will be a fruitful one in which each of us will grow in our relationship with God in Christ, and with one another.

Concordia Lutheran Annual Meeting

January 26th 2020

The Annual Meeting/Ministry Celebration was called to order by Carolyn Alt and Pastor Deb Valentine opened with prayer. Thank you's were extended to outgoing council members Grant Settje and Dawn Addison-Corbit. New members, Carolyn Alt and Judy Martindale were welcomed. Warren and Danita Hanson were thanked for their years of service as church treasurer and janitor, as they have retired from those positions.

We also welcomed Peg Anderson who is stepping into the treasurer position, as well as Brooke Anderson who has taken over the janitorial duties.

Peg Lutt conducted the elections of synod assembly delegates, head usher, audit committee and memorial committee. No more nominations were received from the floor so nominations ceased and ballots were presented as printed. Tellers were Hart Vollers, and Doug and Lynette Krie.

The meeting minutes from 2019 and the council highlights were reviewed. Annual meeting minutes had been approved at Feb 2019 meeting.

Pastor's report was reviewed and motion to approve was made by Mary Vollers with a 2nd by Amanda. Fisher. All in favor.

Pastor may need some help with updating member information going forward.

The Statistical Report was reviewed and motion to approve made by Betty Bothwell and 2^{nd} by Peg Lutt. All in favor.

The Council Highlight Report was reviewed. New goals for 2020 will be established at Feb meeting. Peg Anderson made a motion to accept and Warren Hanson 2nd. All were in favor.

The organizational and financial reports were reviewed. Peg Anderson voiced concerns about budget for 2020 versus actual income for last year showing there would be a deficit. It was noted janitor salary will remain the same for 2020. There may be less expense with board of pensions as Pastor's Medicare is less expensive than the budgeted amount that is based on having health insurance for a potential new pastor. Lynette Krie also mentioned she and Lee Johnson had talked to bank about the buffer account that had not been used in enough years it was in danger of becoming a dormant account. A deposit was made to keep it active, so that money is still available if necessary.

A motion was made by Doug Krie and 2^{nd} by Georgia Addison to accept all of these reports. Motion carried.

Old Business:

There was no old business.

The 135th Anniversary of Concordia will be sometime in 2020. Question put forth as to whether we should do something to celebrate and if so when and what. A potluck was suggested. Volunteers were asked to form a planning committee for this event. Pastor Deb volunteered to help and other committee members will be Lynette Krie, Brandi Settje, Alissa Thompson, and Andrea Johnson.

Hart Vollers gave an update on the furnace/air conditioning issues that have been experienced in past year. The units are old and inefficient and will likely needed attention in the near future. He has gotten a couple bids to replace with updated more energy efficient units and possibly add a 3rd air conditioning unit for basement. Current bid for replacing all 3 current furnaces and 2 air conditioning units and adding a 3rd a/c unit was in \$15,000 range. We need to plan ahead for that coming expense.

Election results were: Head Usher: Warren Hanson, Synod Delegates: Doug and Lynette Krie, Memorial Committee: Andrea Johnson, & Audit Committee: Grant Settje elected to 3 year term and Mary Vollers elected for 2 years to fill out Peter Brummel's term.

Council recommendations were to approve the 2020 budget and that the 2020 Annual Meeting minutes by approved at the Feb council meeting. Dawn Addison-Corbit made a motion to accept recommendations and motion was seconded by Mary Vollers. All were in favor.

Doug Krie made a motion to adjourn with a second by Warren Hanson. All were in favor.


